RE: End PIAA and NFHS Broadcasting Exclusivity

PIAA Board of Directors:

On Monday evening, March 18, the Marion Center High School Lady Stingers played Minersville in the PIAA Girls 2A basketball Eastern final, with a trip to the state championship on the line. Unfortunately, local broadcasters and fans were blocked from covering and streaming this pivotal game due to exclusivity between the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA) and the National Federation of High Schools (NFHS) Network.

Over the past few years, the PIAA entered into an agreement with the NFHS Association, the body that writes the rules of competition for most high school sports and activities in the United States and also provides subscription video streaming services for 27 different sports across the country. Unfortunately, many Pennsylvania high schools have been locked into these "exclusive" video streaming contracts with the NFHS Network, excluding local broadcasters from covering these important games despite their local broadcaster having the resources and experience. One of these broadcasters is locally owned Renda Media. They have been broadcasting local sports for nearly 60 years and operate 15 radio stations in six markets across the commonwealth. They have also augmented their broadcast by adding streaming services to be competitive in the sports streaming market against NFHS. While this additional platform has been welcomed by the local community, and particularly embraced by fans for whom leaving the house is impossible due to a variety of challenges, the exclusivity contract between PIAA and NFHS eliminates Renda Media's ability to do what they do best and require anyone who wishes to stream the game to pay a subscription fee to access it. This is unfair on several levels, the majority of which involve the players on the court who decide the game's outcome and the fans who cheer them on.

During a 2022 hearing the Department of Education assured the General Assembly that the issue of exclusivity between PIAA and the NFHS Network would be resolved. On January 26th, 2023, legislation was introduced to allow visiting teams in high school athletic competitions, and their local broadcasters, the same rights to broadcast, stream, and provide telegraphic play-by-play accounts as the home team. As of today, March 28, 2024, House Bill 30, the Fair Play in Broadcasting Act, has strong bipartisan support and could move from the House Education Committee at any time.

It has become clear that fair broadcasting is not a priority being addressed in the PIAA, as we continue to hear from schools, local broadcasters, and constituents across the Commonwealth. For this reason, it is imperative that

restrictive exclusivity on the streaming of PIAA sports be amended for the benefit of integrity and accessibility to our local broadcasters, high school athletes, and fans. We ask that you take prompt action to fix this issue.
